SYDNEY OLYMPIC PARK

Sydney Olympic Park was a development project for the 2000 Olympic Games, and has since flourished as a destination. It's located just 16 kilometres from Sydney's CBD.

Today, it's a hub for sporting and cultural events, with state-of-the-art venues hosting major festivals and concerts all year round.



MAJOR ATTRACTIONS

📍 ANZ Stadium (anzstadium.com.au)

Since opening in 1999, ANZ Stadium has been the scene of some of the greatest moments in sport. From the spectacular Olympic opening ceremony to Jonny Wilkinson's unforgettable drop goal to win the Rugby World Cup, the Stadium holds a special place in the hearts of sports fans throughout the world. The Explore Tour will take you behind the scenes and allow you to follow in the footsteps of these sporting heroes. Relive the incredible Olympic Games triumphs and tears and step up on the Olympic dais for the ultimate photo souvenir.

📍 DFO Homebush (dfo.com.au)

Sydney's leading retail factory outlet, DFO Homebush, has recently completed its AUD100 million redevelopment to accommodate an expansion of its Australian, international and luxury retail offering.

The premier shopping destination, located 15 kilometres from Sydney, features 126 stores across two levels. The city's first combined factory outlet and homemaker centre includes 90 fashion retailers plus 18 bulky goods and homewares stores including brands Orotan, Polo Ralph Lauren, Hugo Boss, JB HI FI Home, Freedom, Peter Alexander and Lululemon just to name a few!

📍 Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre (aquaticcentre.com.au)

The Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre was the venue for Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Home to four indoor heated pools, a rapid river ride, giant water slide, spa, sauna, steam room, and health club – all surrounded by lush palm trees and colourful mosaics.

📍 Brickpit Ring Walk

The Ring Walk is an elevated circular walkway that allows visitors to access and view the Brickpit from above while preserving the habitat of the endangered Green and Golden Bell frog.

The Ring Walk is 550 metres in circumference and is raised 18.5 metres above the sandstone floor of the Brickpit. The Ring Walk allows many people to experience the Brickpit while fully recognising it as a fragile habitat. Once home the State Brickworks, a self-guided walk past information panels outlines the location's environmental and heritage significance.

📍 Newington Armory (& Armory Gallery)

Newington Armory – formerly the Royal Australian Naval Armament Depot (RANAD) – features over 100 heritage buildings of various ages and types, set amidst a 52 hectare riverside landscape of undulating hills and woodlands. The Heritage Railway operates on weekends and can take you on a unique behind the scenes tour.

Part of the Newington Armory site, the Armory Gallery is housed in Building 18, near the Parramatta River, and is one of the largest armament storehouses constructed prior to World War Two. It now houses a flexible exhibition space that can accommodate 500 visitors at one time.

This extraordinary heritage building has the longest uninterrupted wall space of any gallery in Australia, making it a favourite location for large-scale exhibitions such as the annual ArtExpress.

📍 Bicentennial Park

Bicentennial Park is a diverse natural park combining the Badu Mangroves wetlands, with 40 hectares of beautiful parklands featuring gentle hills, lakeside meadows and soothing green vistas. This park features playgrounds, picnic shelters, barbecues, toilets and several car parks.


📍 Sydney Olympic Park Archery Centre (archerycentre.com.au)

The Sydney Olympic Park Archery Centre was the venue for the Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games Archery competition with Simon Fairweather winning the first ever gold medal for Australia at these games.

Join one of the weekend or school holidays programs suitable for kids and adults, or host a party or corporate team building event. You don't need any experience – all equipment and instruction is provided in a social and fun setting – but bookings are essential. The Sydney Olympic Park Archery Centre also provides Laser Tag, Laser Clay Pigeon Shooting and Bubble Soccer programs.
